The Agriculture Professional Practicum (APP) is designed to provide Australian and international students of agriculture, agribusiness, food science, animal science, environmental science and conservation biology with an introduction to the Indonesian tropical agriculture context and gain hands on experience in the field of their choice.

The Agriculture Professional Practicum (APP) provides Australian students with the opportunity to gain an understanding of the diversity of the tropical ecosystems and challenges facing Indonesian agriculture, food security and the environment. The classroom components of the program (language classes and industry seminar series) will equip students with the language skills and cultural awareness necessary to operate effectively during their professional placements. The practicum placement allows students to gain practical experience in Indonesia's agriculture, and related, industries.

This program is overseen by an experienced academic with extensive knowledge of the Indonesian agriculture sector.

The program runs from early January until mid-February each year.

What is involved?

- ◆ 2 weeks of intensive Indonesian language classes (mornings);
- ◆ 2 weeks of seminars, workshops and presentations by expert academics and practitioners within the field of Indonesian agriculture (afternoons); and
- ◆ A 4-week supervised professional placement with an Indonesian or international research institute, production and processing company, government department or non-government organisation (NGO).

What will you get out of it?

- ◆ A professional experience in Indonesian agriculture and a chance to establish your networks in Indonesia;
- ◆ A detailed professional evaluation suitable for your CV or as a job reference; and
- ◆ Academic credit towards your university degree.
