Creative Arts & Design Professional Practicum (CADPP)

Opening up Indonesia's creative economy to Australian university students

What is ACICIS?

The Australian Consortium for 'In-Country' Indonesian Studies (ACICIS) is the longest running provider of in-country Indonesian study programs for Australian university students and the primary mechanism through which Australian students pursue study in Indonesia for academic credit.

From small beginnings as a facilitator of accredited in-country Indonesian language study, ACICIS' program offerings have grown to include semester-long and six-week professional practicum programs in a range of disciplines, including journalism, development, business, law, and international relations.

ACICIS is a consortium of twenty-five Australian member universities (including all of the Group of Eight) as well as overseas centres-of-excellence in the field of Indonesian and Southeast Asian Studies, such as SOAS at the University of London and Leiden University.

Stakeholder Input

The CADPP was designed and implemented in 2017 with the support of the Australian Government's New Colombo Plan. The next iteration in 2018 also had the support of the New Colombo Plan.

ACICIS has received over \$294,000 to support up to 98 students to undertake the program between 2018 and 2020. Thirteen ACICIS-member universities - RMIT University, UNSW Australia, University of Tasmania, Griffith University, The University of Western Australia, University of Technology Sydney, Murdoch University, University of the Sunshine Coast, The University of Melbourne, Charles Darwin University, The Australian National University, and The University of Adelaide - presently have funding to support students participation in this program.

The CADPP was developed with the assistance of a number of ACICIS member university academics who participated on the CADPP Advisory Panel. This panel provided advice on the course outline to ensure the program meets the needs of the consortium members.

What is the CADPP?

- ◆ A six-week intensive academic and vocational study program in Indonesia for high-achieving upper undergraduate Australian and international students;
- ◆ Students undertake two weeks of intensive Indonesian language learning and industry-led seminars on the Indonesian creative economy;
- ◆ Students then complete a four-week industry internship placement with a participating Australian or Indonesian organisation;
- ◆ Students are selected each year on a strictly competitive-entry basis, with evidence of excellent academic achievement, voluntary and professional experience;
- ◆ Students are eligible to receive academic credit for the program towards their home degree.

Industry Sponsors

ACICIS is seeking sponsorship from businesses interested in increasing their links with Indonesia, and in supporting the development of Indonesia-literate students in the fields of creative arts and design.

Industry support for the program may include:

- ◆ One-off or ongoing financial contributions to the ACICIS CADPP program.
- ◆ Scholarships and/ or travel grants provided directly to CADPP students, or;
- ◆ Internship positions for CADPP students.

In return, ACICIS will:

- ◆ Acknowledge the support of sponsors and supporters in promotional material;
- ◆ Provide talented interns for industry placements; and
- ◆ Enable sponsors to attract talented Indonesia-literate graduates to their organisations.
