# ACICIS' Law Professional Practicum (LPP)

Opening up Indonesia's legal sector to Australian university students

## What is ACICIS?

The Australian Consortium for 'In-Country' Indonesian Studies (ACICIS) is the longest running provider of in-country Indonesian study programs for Australian university students and the primary mechanism through which Australian students pursue study in Indonesia for academic credit.

From small beginnings as a facilitator of accredited in-country Indonesian language study, ACICIS' program offerings have grown to include six-week and semester-long professional practicum programs in a range of disciplines including journalism, law, business, creative arts, development, agriculture and international relations.

ACICIS is a consortium of twenty four Australian member universities (including all of the Group of Eight) as well as overseas centres of excellence in the field of Indonesian and Southeast Asian Studies, such as SOAS at Leiden University and the University of London.

## Stakeholder Input

The LPP was designed and implemented in 2018 with support of the Australian Government's New Colombo Plan.

ACICIS has received over \$447,000 to support up to 149 students to undertake the program between 2018 and 2020. Sixteen ACICIS member universities – Queensland University of Technology, UNSW Australia, University of Technology Sydney, Monash University, University of the Sunshine Coast, Macquarie University, The University of Adelaide, Curtin University, The University of Western Australia, University of Tasmania, Flinders University, La Trobe University, Swinburne University, The Australian National University, and University of South Australia – presently have funding to support students participation in this program.

ACICIS is currently inviting input from member university academics on the LPP course outline to ensure the program meets the needs of consortium members.

## What is the LPP?

A six-week intensive academic and vocational study program for high-achieving upper undergraduate Australian and international law students;

Students undertake two weeks of intensive language learning and industry-led seminars on the Indonesian legal industry;

Students then complete a four-week industry internship placement with a participating Australian or Indonesian organisation;

Students are selected on a strictly competitive-entry basis, with evidence of excellent academic achievement, voluntary and professional experience;

Students are eligible to receive academic credit for the program towards their home degree.

## Industry Sponsors

ACICIS is seeking sponsorship from business and organisations interested in increasing their links with Indonesia, and in supporting the development of Indonesia-literate students in the legal field. Industry support for the program may include:

- ◆ One-off or ongoing financial contributions to the ACICIS LPP program
- ◆ Internship positions for LPP students, or;
- ◆ Scholarships and/or travel grants provided directly to LPP students.

In return, ACICIS will:
