Use your summer to gain an understanding of sustainable tourism practices in Bali

The need to develop sustainable tourism practices is a rapidly emerging issue in Indonesia.

The Sustainable Tourism Professional Practicum (STPP) provides Australian students with the opportunity to gain an understanding of the social, cultural and political systems that underpin the tourism industry in Indonesia, and to consider issues relating to sustainability and resource management within the sector.

The classroom components of the program (language classes and industry seminar series) will equip students with the language skills and cultural awareness necessary to operate effectively during their professional placements. The practicum placement allows students to gain work experience in tourism and hospitality management and other commercial practices within Indonesia's tourism and hospitality sector.

The program is overseen by an academic specialist with expertise in sustainable tourism practices in the Indonesian context.

The program runs from early January until mid-February each year.

What is involved?

- ◆ Indonesian language classes;
- ◆ Seminars delivered by industry practitioners and experts drawn from Indonesia's tourism and hospitality industries; and
- ◆ Supervised professional placement providing students with a professional experience in Indonesia's tourism sector.

What will you get out of it?

- ◆ Professional experience and a chance to establish contacts within Indonesia's hospitality and tourism sector;
- ◆ A detailed professional evaluation suitable for your CV or as a job reference; and
- ◆ Academic credit towards your university degree (by negotiated with your university).
