Begin your Business Career in Asia by undertaking a virtual internship

Designed for students who have no existing language skills, this virtual internship program opens up the opportunity for students of business, management and marketing to put business theory and analysis into practice in Jakarta's growing economy.

Indonesia is predicted to be the world's fourth largest economy and will be a key economic partner in the future.

Students will gain a foothold in the Indonesian business world, developing their professional skills in an online working environment.

The virtual program runs twice a year. Once over a six-week (intensive) period from early January until mid-February (summer) and once over a twelve-week (intensive/flexible) period from late June until late September (winter).

Applications for the Winter Program close 1 April
