Begin your legal career in Asia by undertaking a virtual internship

The Law Professional Practicum (LPP) is designed to provide Australian and international law students with an introduction to the Indonesian legal system and an opportunity to put legal theory and analysis into practice within an Indonesian context.

Indonesia's legal system is characterised by complexity and pluralism. It is the product of inherited colonial European civic and criminal codes, 70 years of post-independence legal reforms under both authoritarian and democratic regimes, and residual – and often overlapping bodies of pre-colonial Islamic law and traditional or customary law. With increasingly important commercial, trade, tourism, and security links between Australia and Indonesia, understanding the legal system of Australia's northern neighbour has never been more important.

The LPP will allow students to dip their toe into the waters of Indonesia's legal system, and to develop their professional skills, while building their networks within the Indonesian legal fraternity.

This program is overseen by an experienced legal professional with extensive knowledge of the Indonesian legal system.

The virtual program runs twice a year. Once over a six-week (intensive) period from early January until mid-February (summer) and once over a twelve-week (intensive/flexible) period from late June until late September (winter).
